Owens Corning Roof Deployment Project Gives Back to U.S. Military Veterans

Pensacola, FL – February 26, 2019 – Owens Corning Platinum Contractors are working with Purple Heart Homes Inc to provide new roofs to veterans in need and their families as part of the *Owens Corning Roof Deployment Project*.

Arthur Keller, a 73-year-old veteran, will receive a new roof on Tuesday, Feb. 26, from Tadlock Roofing, Inc., an Owens Corning Roofing Platinum Contractor. This nationwide effort is a way to show gratitude and honor the veterans who served our country and the families who support them. Since the inception of the Owens Corning National Roof Deployment Project in 2016, more than 100 military members have received new roofs.

Arthur Keller watched his father serve in the U.S. Army and spend four years at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. After witnessing the courage put forth by his father, Arthur decided to enlist in the Army as well. Arthur served as a Specialist First Class at Fort Bliss in Texas before he was stationed in Okinawa with the 62nd Artillery. He returned stateside to complete the remainder of his active duty back at Fort Bliss and was discharged in 1968.

“The roof on Arthur’s house as well as his front porch is in need of serious repair,” said Dale Tadlock, Owner and President, Tadlock Roofing, Inc. “We want to provide Arthur with the necessary renovations to make his home safe and comfortable. It is the least we can do to show our appreciation for this veteran.”

Owens Corning Roofing and its network of independent Platinum Contractors, along with support from the Owens Corning Foundation, are donating roofing materials and labor to replace roofing shingles on the homes of military veterans and their families throughout the country.
